<u>GENERAL APPEARANCE</u>: Typical French hound, distinguished, giving an impression of being rustic.

HEAD: Quite large, moderately elongated.

CRANIAL REGION:

Skull: Slightly domed, occipital crest barely marked. Without

prominent superciliary arches.

Stop: Well marked.

FACIAL REGION:

Nose: Well developed, black, brown-orange.

Muzzle: Of almost equal length to that of the skull.

<u>Lips</u>: Quite pronounced giving the muzzle a certain squareness.

Eyes: Large, brown and dark.

Ears : Set slightly below eye level, supple, fine, slightly twisted and

reaching to about to two fingers from the on-set of the nose.

NECK: Straight, quite long, slight dewlap.

BODY:

<u>Back</u>: Broad and straight. <u>Loin</u>: Normally arched.

Croup: Round without falling away.

<u>Chest</u>: Broad. Ribs rounded.

Flank: Well filled.

TAIL: Long.

LIMBS

<u>FOREQUARTERS</u>: Strong and broad. <u>Shoulders</u>: Sloping and well muscled.

HINDQUARTERS:

Thighs: Very muscular.

<u>Hocks</u>: Near to the ground and slightly bent.

<u>FEET</u>: Hare-feet.

GAIT/MOVEMENT: Rather easy, gallop light and sustained.

<u>SKIN</u>: White with yellow or orange markings; the palate can be yellow. Scrotum white or yellow.

COAT

HAIR: Short and fine.

 $\underline{\text{COLOUR}}$: White-lemon or white and orange on condition that the orange is not too dark going on to red.

SIZE:

<u>Height at the withers</u>: 62-70 cm with 2 cm tolerance for the maximum size.

FAULTS: Any departure from the foregoing points should be considered a fault and the seriousness with which the fault should be regarded should be in exact proportion to its degree and its effect upon the health and welfare of the dog.

- Muzzle thin or too long.
- Overshot or undershot mouth.
- Light eyes.
- Tail curved up or deviated.
- Colours of the coat other than those previously mentioned, particularly black or red hair.
- Depigmentation.

Any dog clearly showing physical or behavioural abnormalities shall be disqualified.

<u>N.B.</u>: Male animals should have two apparently normal testicles fully descended into the scrotum.
